Although things have been relatively quiet - unsurprisingly - we have been kept moderately busy providing music in health and social care situations, and despite funding cuts, engagements for the new year are coming in. Steve assisted *Chris McMahon* (who co-ordinates activities for elderly patients at *St. Mary's Hospital* Paddington) with his fundraising efforts by remembering a specific time Steve spent on the wards. "I have a striking memory of one patient, face-down on the bed and apparently disengaged from the world, suddenly and unexpectedly singing along with one of the songs."



Most of this work still comes from Music in Hospitals but LETSwing also work independently. For example they provided a duo for an outdoor Bankside Open Spaces *Trust* event to mark the opening of a new playground.

They also provided a duo for a Christmas sing-along at Southwark Park Day Centre.

LETSwing are flexible in terms of what they provide in order to fit a wide range of budgets. They can even split into two and play 2 concerts at different locations simultaneously, as they did at Christmas.
